• **PILLAR OF LIGHT**

The Spur lamp rises in a single sweep, reaching two metres above floor level. You can choose direct or concealed lighting, as some of its light is directed upwards and some is reflected to the sides. The man behind the lamp is Christian von Ahn, a German designer who works in Italy. Spur is made by Kristalite and is available in white, aluminium and red. Price around 160 euros. www.kristalite.it ☐



• **RETROSPECT** Italian Francesco Binfante started his career as a designer back in the 1960s, and echoes of that era can be found in his On The Rocks sofa which he has designed for Edra. The 1990s was the decade in which module thinking in design had its breakthrough and On The Rocks is definitely a sofa with its roots in that school. It consists of four irregularly shaped parts which can be combined in a number of ways. www.edra.com ☐

• **THE THREE CHAIRS**

Most people know the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Danish designer Christian Flindt has called his family of three stackable stools in three sizes to suit all members of the family Goldilock.
